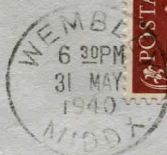

Darling Son.

Saw field card with your signature
dated 23 May. came this morning. How
joy we had to see it - Daddy & I first, I came
running to find me, I was with overcome
with relief to see that little square of
buff paper. I glad you got the little parcel
of Sherry & both powder sent off to you on 10th.

I have written several letters since, but no
parcels are allowed to be sent now or registered
packets & letters not heavier than 2oz.

Every day we have letters from friends of us both
asking if you are safe, & when we heard of you
and continual enquiries over the 'phone as
to your welfare. The news from France is still
very bad, but we feel just a wee bit lighter in
heart because of this field card!!

Since starting this letter I have had a letter
from Stanley asking when we had heard ^{of you} he is
most kind & sympathizing is Stanley. Mr. Perry
is too - most attentive in writing & asking for you.

wounded. Did I tell you that Connie & the
Wednesday working party have got up by Bridge Lea
& sales of work £550 for the Red +. it is ear-
marked for an ambulance in France, it was all
due to Connie's hard work & personality. At the end
of the sale of work on Wednesday, when the amount was
announced - one of the members of the working
party stepped forward & presented Connie

with a gold bracelet identical with the one I gave
her. What a commotion all this is causing at airway!
but oh! so pleasant - it is good to see such good
result from all they have done all the winter.

Dad is going for a few days change on Sunday, not
far, as he must be within call of A.D.E. they are
working 24 hrs. a day now & 7 days a week 9 P.M.
to 5 A.M.

May I send one of your photos to Dorothy Lillie?
I wanted Dad to do so - but he said he did not
care to do that until hearing from you, but I felt
that we would have heard from you about them
if it had not been for this offensive -

I am sure. I much love dear - dear from Mother.
