My Darling Son -

We have had nothing since last time
when we had your field card dated 23 May.
I could hardly believe it came on last Friday
it seems weeks since we got it - oh! so very
thankful to get it - we just wept! - And now
we just wonder & wonder how it goes with you, & wish
we could send something more than a letter for
your comfort - but registered packets for
parcels are allowed through the Army Post -
& letters must not exceed 2oz. in weight.

Daddy went off on Saturday for a few days & I
hope he may get a week - but they are going
full time at A.D.E. I have taken in a portion
of Holm oak - the complete factor Holm oak
has been taken over by the air ministry (I don't
know what side of the ministry) & the garden
of Dutch Home is dug in trenches. Graham
this is working a day & night shift - & on Sundays
as well. So many enquiries for you my
dear Joe - Doris Brewster wrote this morning
asking how you were? - as if you were in

in pocket? — Mrs. Richards of Woodville
also rang up, hoped you were among those men
evacuated from France? Shauly has just written
again asking for you — his letter came as I was
writing this — Dr. Croft he says came home with
some wounded, he may be able Oct 2 days off be-
fore going back — poor Kathleen was overjoyed
when he telephoned late one night after arrival
at the port in England, he was not yet home
for he hopes to be in "at home" —

The weather still continues glorious, all around
is beautiful — the garden just now I think at its
height of beauty — Linus thinks so too! Loves
lying on some nice soft patch of fresh plants!
He is such a dear old thing — even though long
I am sure he understood we were troubled about
you — for he was most attentive in keeping news
us when I showed him your field card, he rubbed
up beside us — slobbering all over!!

Shauly is very busy finding billets for evacuees —
Mr. Perry has taken 2 little boys into Bush Close —
Kosa has gone for 2 weeks holiday, & Mr. & Mrs. Pugh
are here with me while Kosa is away, they have a little
